Chaplain's Message

The month of February is dedicated to the Holy Family. The special devotion which proposes the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph as the model of virtue of all Christian households began in the 17th century. It started almost simultaneously in Canada and France: the Association of the Holy Family was founded in Montreal in 1663, and by the Daughters of the Holy Family in Paris in 1674. This devotion soon spread and in 1893 Pope Leo XIII expressed his approval of a feast.

The feast was welcomed by succeeding Pontiffs as an efficacious means for bringing home to the Christian people the example of the Holy Family at Nazareth, and by the restoration of the true spirit of family life.

In the words of His Holiness Pope Leo XIII, "Nothing truly can be more salutary or efficacious for Christian families to meditate upon than the example of this Holy Family, which embraces the perfection and completeness of all domestic virtues."

'The home of Nazareth is the school where we begin to understand the life of Jesus—the school of the Gospel. First, then, a lesson of silence. May esteem for silence, that admirable and indispensable condition of mind, revive in us...A lesson on family life.' Pope Paul VI at Nazareth, January 5, 1964.

The Holy Family models for us what family life should exemplify. It is a school of virtue for both parents and children. There we find God, and learn how to connect with God and with others. The family is where love is freely given without self-interest. It is where we learn to love, to pray and to practice the gift of charity. Pope John Paul II has said, "The family, more than any other human reality, is the place in which the person is loved for himself and in which he learns to live the sincere gift of self".

Parenting is a very challenging responsibility and at times errors are made despite the best intentions. Recognizing this, children should trust their parents and never forget that parents want only what is best for them.

Which leads us to what may be the most important family virtue — forgiveness. Living so intimately within the family nucleus naturally gives rise to unpleasant situations where someone is apt to be offended. St. Paul knew this when he told us to "bear with and forgive one another."

Field Agent's Message

There are a great many benefits to joining the Knights of Columbus. That is probably very obvious to you, since you are already a member. But there may be some benefits about which you are unaware. Do you know about the Family Fraternal Benefit Program?

The Family Fraternal Benefit Program makes available to eligible family members[†] five distinct types of assistance:

- 1. In the case of minor children who are physically challenged or mentally impaired, the Knights of Columbus:
 - a. Offers a \$1,500 death benefit to the family when a child dies less than 61 days after his birth;
 - b. Pays \$750 for the child who is stillborn at least 20 weeks after conception;
 - c. Offers guaranteed-issue life insurance up to \$5,000 to any child under age 18.
- 2. Orphan Benefit \$80 monthly allotment for orphans of eligible families; with up to \$7,000 in college scholarships available.
- 3. Member/Spouse Fraternal Benefit Accidental death coverage for the member and his spouse at no cost.

† To be eligible, the member must be in good standing with his Council and either he or his wife must be insured under a Knights of Columbus certificate requiring an annual premium of at least \$150 or providing at least \$5,000 permanent life insurance coverage.



BUILDING THE DOMESTIC CHURCH BOOK KIOSK



Building the Domestic Church Book Kiosk – by the Numbers

During Lent and Advent last year, our Council set up a kiosk displaying 15 booklets from the Knights of Columbus *Building the Domestic Church* series. The series is a collection of popular Catholic Information Service (CIS) books focused on issues of vital importance for Catholic families seeking to build up and strengthen the church at home. Offered to Parishioners free-of-charge, the booklets greatly emphasize the faith and spirituality of all Knights of Columbus and encourage other Parish families to do the same.

To begin to illustrate the impact these booklets might have on the families of St. Agnes, here are a few facts and figures:

- There are 15 different booklet titles in the *Domestic Church* series
- The kiosk was only exhibited twice in 2018:
 - Lent: February 7 to April 16 (10 weeks)
 - Advent : November 19 to January 13, 2019 (8 weeks)
- During the 18 weeks the kiosk was on display, a total of 261 booklets were taken (an average of 14.5 booklets per week)
- Most popular titles (122 copies total):
 - Prayer Time 30 copies
 - Lord, Teach Us to Pray 29 copies
 - A Scriptural Rosary for the Family 23 copies
 - The Family Fully Alive 21 copies
 - Saint Joseph: Our Father in Faith 19 copies
- All provided at no cost to Parishioners
- The cost to the Council is 67¢ per booklet

We have re-stocked the booklets and will reintroduce the kiosk again in March for Lent.





Knights of Columbus Donates 1,000th Ultrasound Machine

The Knights of Columbus has donated its 1,000th ultrasound machine to pregnancy centers around the world, fulfilling a 10-year initiative to give millions of babies a chance at life.

This 10-year program started with a donation of two life-saving ultrasound machines to pro-life pregnancy centers in 2009. On Jan. 14, Knights from Father Herman J. Vegar Council 5561 in Warrenton, Va., donated machine number 1,000 to the Mother of Mercy Free Medical Clinic in Manassas, Va.

Supreme Knight Carl Anderson was present at the unveiling of the new machine, along with representatives from Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Arlington. Anderson said that the Knights' Ultrasound Initiative is the greatest humanitarian effort the organization has ever undertaken.

"One of the proudest days of my life as Supreme Knight was when I heard that we had placed the 1,000th machine here in Virginia," said Supreme Knight Carl Anderson. "There's an old



proverb that whoever saves a child saves a world. No phrase could better describe this ultrasound program. We are saving worlds. We are letting women know the truth."

"Today represents a very concrete way in which millions of lives are changed for the better by the Catholic community coming together and volunteering together," said Anderson. "What greater legacy can a person have than to save a child's life?"

The Ultrasound Initiative is a staple of the Faith in Action program developed by the Knights of Columbus. Over \$49 million in machines have been donated to pro-life pregnancy centers in all 50 states and Puerto Rico, as well as Brazil, Canada, Jamaica, Peru, and Africa.
