Grand Knight's Corner

First and most importantly – it's official: We are going to start meeting <u>in-person</u> again this month!

Brothers:

I am honored to serve you, as Grand Knight of St. Agnes Council.

Twelve years ago this month, I became the Grand Knight of Council 13179 at St. Francis of Assisi Parish in Concord. I had been a Knight less than five years, but I remembered sitting at one of my first council meetings in 2004 and thinking that being Grand Knight looked like fun. In 2006, I was elected to the position of Warden. That was followed by Chancellor, then Deputy Grand Knight, and then Grand Knight in 2009.

It was Fr. McGivney's original design that a Grand Knight would have spent one year as Warden, one year as Chancellor, and one year as Deputy Grand Knight before becoming Grand Knight. That progression, known as "going through the chairs," was designed by Fr. McGivney to ensure that an incoming Grand Knight had had the experience of watching three other men perform the duties of Grand Knight before he wore the Grand Knight's jewel.

My predecessor as Grand Knight of St. Francis of Assisi council was not only involved in planning every activity, he was present at every activity (he was retired). When I took over, I knew there was no way I was going to be able to do what he had done. So, at the council's July 2009 meeting, my first as Grand Knight, I told the council that with a full -time job and four kids at home (one of whom, Ana, was just eight months old at the time – she's now 12 years old), I would be hard pressed to be present at every council activity like my predecessor had been. So, I asked that each member get involved and take part in the council's activities as much as possible – and that they did.


