

Our Seminarian Ramon Urbina is Ordained a Deacon

Bishop Michael C. Barber ordained our Council's adopted seminarian Ramon Urbina to the transitional diaconate on August 14 at Old Mission San Jose in Fremont.

In his homily, Bishop Barber explained that the ordinations of transitional deacons are traditionally conducted at the Mission and the subsequent ordinations to the priesthood are conducted at the Cathedral. This tradition signifies the old and the new, the ancient and the modern, proof of the church's continuation through time.

During the Rite of Ordination, Bishop Barber performed the Election of the Candidate. The Election concluded with Bishop Barber saying the words:

...Relying on the help of the Lord God and our Savior Jesus Christ, we choose Ramon, our brother, for the Order of the Diaconate.

To which the assembled guests were to reply:

Thanks be to God.

According to the program, the guests' response was to be followed by "Reverent applause." The actual response was more like the applause one would expect at a graduation ceremony (including the whoops and whistles), which caused Bishop Barber to smile and Ramon to turn towards the guests and meekly attempt to quiet his fans.

We look forward to Brother Deacon Ramon's ordaination to the priesthood in the spring of 2022.
